# Primary for KC will be Tuesday

## Candidates run for mayor, council

Kansas City voters go to the polls Tuesday for the City Council primary election. The top two vote-getters in each race will advance to the general election March 25. In races where there are only two candidates, both will advance.

Polls will be open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Four candidates are on the ballot for mayor: Kay Barnes, the incumbent; retired comedy club promoter Stan Glazer; efficiency consultant Mary De Shon; and retired Fire Department battalion chief Anne Wedow.

Each of the 12 council seats is up for election. At-large candidates must reside in one of the six districts but are elected citywide and represent the entire city. In-district candidates run in their particular district. Following are the candidates for those races:
